Luke Bearfield

East Side High School

Luke Bearfield was born in Newark, NJ. Son of Luke Bearfield Sr. and Florence Bearfield. He graduated from Hawkins Street Elementary School. His father's friend Charles Steinburg- who always wanted African American players, introduced him to the sport of hockey, this led Luke to join Essex County Instructional League where he was awarded a 2-week scholarship to train in Alberta, Canada at the Sir Dunn Area. The next year Luke's love for hockey evolved along with his talent for the game;

He committed himself to 2 club teams, Cedar Grove Bruins and Essex County Rockets. Luke was an all-around sport fanatic he also played Football for the Ironbound Suns.

Luke attended Seton Hall Prep for 2 years where he furthered his hockey career granting him 2nd team NJSIAA "A" division honors. His junior year Luke transferred to East Side High School. At this time, he played for Coach Leonardis, ending the season as "C" division Champs. Luke was the team's leading scorer as well as landing 1st team NJSIAA "C" division honors.

Luke's senior year he was able to indulge in Football, gaining a starting position as safety. And his senior year for hockey, Luke and his team was "B" division runner ups. Luke was the division's leading scorer accomplishing 2 school records with 5 consecutive goals scored in one game and 10 points in the game (7 goals and 3 assist). Luke finishes his senior year with 1st team "B" division NJSIAA honors and MVP. After the season, East Side High had the opportunity to play abroad, becoming the first high school hockey team from New Jersey to play Sweden in the finals.

After graduation, he continued to play at CCM and was the team's leading scorer, also selected 1st team MCHC honors. Luke loved hockey but always had a soft spot for football. He decided to go back to help as assistant coach at East side High School, that was just the start. Luke loved to teach kids the fundamental of the game and gave many years of coaching to several Youth Football Programs for more than 30 years.

He is married to Brenda Bearfield, has 3 daughters, Kia Bearfield-Smith, Iris Bearfield, and Lanee' Bearfield-Bland. Two of his daughters followed in his footsteps, coaching for over 15 years and leading their teams to 2 Essex County Cheer Championships for Newark Collegiate Academy. His grandson, Shamir Bearfield played D1 and D1AA football and graduated from William & Mary, leading him to an assistant coaching position at Fairleigh Dickerson University.



Bruce Butts

Barringer High School

Growing up in Tampa, Florida from June 1952 until May of 1963 was a magical experience. The year before, the Russians were threatening a nuclear attack against the United States from Cuba and every child my age in Florida, feared that they would be the 1st state to be annihilated. Coincidentally, living in Newark on south 9th street, our front door was directly facing the main entrance to the Presbyterian/United Hospitals.

Andy Williams was a Barringer H.S. athlete who intrigued Bruce with stories about Football, Wrestling, Track Upward and the Outward-Bound programs whenever they were at church. Academically Bruce got involved in Seton Hall's Upward Bound precollege program. It really expanded his perceptions of college life, scholarships, the arts and it gave him some understanding about the American roller coaster ride as the nation reeled from social unrest and social consciousness. Bruce also enjoyed the Outward-Bound experience for 26 days in August of 1968, in Carbondale, Colorado. Backpacking in Colorado went from learning fundamental camping skills in that oxygen poor air, to extreme survival training in some of the most beautiful landscapes in the world above 12,000 feet.

At Barringer, Bruce wrestled for Coach Naporano as a 115-pound JV freshman. Bruce finally made varsity his junior year at 157lbs. His senior year at 178 pounds, he won the Newark City Tournament and the New Jersey Interscholastic Athletic Association District Title with Coach Michael Fitzsimmons in 1970.

After graduation, he attended Seton Hall University and attained a B.S. degree in education in August 1974. As a freshman Bruce wrestled at 167 pounds for three years and 177 pounds his sophomore year. Coaches John Allen and Al Reinoso knew how to get blood from a stone. They squeezed, polished, simonized and refined the practices until they all had that glow and were ready for prime time, national competition. In 1973 Shaker Heights, Ohio at John Carroll University, Bruce attended the National Catholic Invitational Wrestling Tournament and for some reason they consistently failed to use the long ē sound when addressing our team by name. For motivational purposes, Seton Hall's 126 pounder (Percy Martin from Westside H.S.) defeated the number one seed in his weight class who was from John Carroll U. Percy took 2nd place in that tournament and Bruce took 3rd. The following year 1974, Percy and Bruce were the only African American, division-1 co-captains in the country. When they returned to the 1974 National Catholic Invitational Wrestling Tournament Bruce went to the finals, taking 2nd place. When Percy Martin, Don Hart (Essex Catholic H.S.), Taras Olesnyckyj (Vailsburg H.S.) and Bruce left the gym that evening, they put some respect on the name "Seton Hall" especially the pronunciation.

Bruce was selected as "Black Sports" magazine's Athlete of The Month in 1974's winter addition. Very few athletes in minor sports were extended this type of recognition and to be considered over so many other worthy and talented students, was an exceptional honor.

Father Edwin Leahy of Saint Benedict Prep offered Bruce his 1st teaching and coaching job and Bruce discovered that being a good competitor and being a good coach are two different animals. After 5 years of teaching at the Cincinnati Job Corp Center and 5 years as a Police Officer in Plant City, Florida, he returned to teach in the Newark Public School system for 25 years before retiring in 2015. Bruce's passion has been teaching and coaching Barringer H.S. students to become reasonable and responsible adults and it's come with many rewards.

Sports and Athletics most certainly shapes the attitudes of our youth for becoming good leaders and it creates a climate for learning through examples.



Tim Byron

**Our Lady of the Valley High School
Seton Hall University**

Tim was born in the Vailsburg section of Newark. He attended Sacred Heart Elementary School and Our Lady of the Valley High School. At the Valley, Tim played football, wrestling and baseball and in his senior year, he was named captain of all three teams. Of all the sports, baseball was his strongest. While at the Valley, he played under his uncle, Ted Fiore, and the team won a State Championship. Tim was named an All- State Pitcher, leading him to be drafted by the Oakland Athletics.

Tim received a full baseball scholarship to Seton Hall University and played under uncle, Mike Sheppard Sr. While at Seton Hall; he was a member of two regional finals and was named Northeast All American Pitcher. He is a member of the Seton Hall University Hall of Fame and holds the Career Record for Pitching Wins; he was also named a top 50 male athlete at Seton Hall. Tim graduated with a B.S. degree in Physical Education and has a Master's degree in administration. After graduation, he was drafted by the New York Yankees playing 6 years and making it to the AAA level.

Tim currently is teaching and coaching at Northern Valley Regional High School-Old Tappan. His coaching career includes close to 600 career wins, a Group 3 State Championship, and two Bergen County Championships. He resides in East Hanover, NJ with his wife (and high school sweetheart) Nancy and has two children- Casey and Tim Jr.

East Side High School

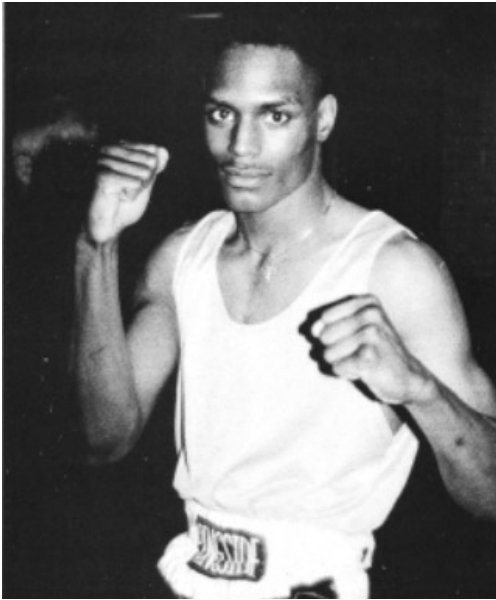

Sports and baseball in particular, was his first love, fun, competition and motivation and gave him opportunities in early poor project life. At East Side High, Rudy was blessed to play on really good teams with great teammates and they won a lot! He made All-City and All-County and All-State as a centerfielder. His senior season, he batted over 400 and was selected to the All-Metropolitan Team (CT, NY, and NJ) and they were honored at Yankee Stadium. He was placed in Yankee farm system and played in college and didn’t give up until he realized he wasn’t going to replace Mickey Mantle as Yankee centerfielder.

Comick also made All-City in football (1966-67) and earned a scholarship to Kentucky State University as outside linebacker. After college graduation in 1972 he returned to Newark as a teacher, mentor, coach and wore the many hats inner-city teachers wear, for 35 years.

He also made honorable mention in basketball during an era when Newark was ridiculously great! After his college years he discovered tennis during the boom of the Arthur Ashe years beginning in the mid 70s and beyond. Gifted in that “new” sport, Rudy won many championships and attained a high national ranking. He played in tournaments from Boston, MS through Ft. Lauderdale, FL for over 30 years in the American Tennis Association (ATA).

Rudy’s life is so blessed and again he always thanks the Lord for carrying him through his “idiot” stages of life and now with his wonderful wife Cherene, he gets to serve other people. Thanks and much love to his dear close-knit family (the Comicks) and friends. Much love and even though he now has an “old man Fred Sanford” waddle-walk in the mornings, he wouldn’t change a thing.



Harvey Dock, Jr.

Newark Boxing

Irvington High School

Many may recognize Harvey Dock, as one of the more frequently recognized boxing officials in the country, but what many may not realize is that Harvey Dock was once a standout amateur boxer from Newark NJ.

Harvey began boxing out of Carolyn Kelly's First-Class Championship Development Center, located on Branford Place, downtown Newark. He eventually began training at 5th Precinct and finished his career representing Red Brick Gym in East Newark.

Dock began boxing at 14 and captured a few tournaments along the way. Having competed on a national and international level, Dock has garnered boxing acclaim as an amateur boxer, capturing the 1993 and 1994 NJ State Championships. He also won the prestigious New Jersey State Golden Gloves Championship in the 156lb. weight division in 1994. In that same year, Dock also went on to capture the Region 1 Championship in Lake Placid, New York. Winning the Region 1 Championship awarded Dock the opportunity to compete in the National tournament in Colorado Springs, where he dropped a close decision in the quarter finals. In that same year, Dock also showed well in the Golden Gloves National Tournament in 1994 in Milwaukee, dropping a decision in the quarterfinals to Milwaukee standout Michael Nunnally.

For his accomplishments, Dock was inducted into the New Jersey Boxing Hall of Fame in 1994, after receiving the 1994 Amateur Boxer of the Year Award. During the height of Dock's amateur career, he trained at the famed Red Brick Gym, under the tutelage of 1984 Olympian Jose Rosario also from Newark. During his career, Dock also trained under the late Bill Ryan, and Alvin Johnson, also a Newark amateur boxing standout. With a string of amateur championships under his belt, it was a crucial point in his life where he had to decide what was next in his boxing career.

Dock entered the New York Golden Gloves in 1996, winning 3 decisions, before losing a 3-2 decision in the semi-finals to Josiah Judah. Dock, who never had aspirations of turning professional decided to give the paid ranks a try, and won his only professional fight in 1997, winning a unanimous decision over Charles Horn.

With the competition bug satisfied, Dock, who still loved the sport of boxing turned his attention to officiating boxing matches in the amateurs. Dock began his amateur career as a referee/judge in 1998 and was given his license to referee professional bouts in 2003 from New Jersey State Commissioner Larry Hazzard, also a tremendous amateur boxer from Newark and a Newark Athletic Hall of Famer himself.

Dock has catapulted his knowledge in the amateur ranks to one of better officials in professional boxing, having currently refereed over 40 world title bouts.



Gerald (Jerry) Gallicchio

Vailsburg High School

Jerry Gallicchio has had many accomplishments pertaining to basketball throughout his life. He was raised in Vailsburg, a neighborhood in Newark, New Jersey. This is where he attended St Joseph's School for his elementary education and Our Lady of the Valley, as well as Vailsburg High School for his secondary education.

In 1977, Jerry's 8th grade year at St Joseph's School, he averaged 52.3 points a game. He once scored 77 points in a single game at the Our Lady of the Valley basketball tournament.

The years of 1977 to 1978 is when Jerry became a starter as a freshman on the Our Lady of the Valley varsity basketball team coached by Ted Fiore, only 11 games into the season. In the championship of the ECT Final, Our Lady of the Valley beat Shabazz High School 56- 51, claiming their first Essex County championship in school's history.

Jerry's sophomore year, 1978-1979, is when he made 3rd team All County. He went to the ECT Final in which they beat Orange High School who were #1 in the state with a 30 - 0 record. Jerry scored 18 points and 10 rebounds during this winning game. The team also won the state championship in 1979 beating St Joseph's School.

During his junior year, 1979 to 1980, Jerry averaged 18.6 points per game with 13.1 rebounds per game. That season Jerry became 1st team All State Parochial, as well as 1st team All Essex County. Jerry also became the Star Ledger Boy Athlete of the week & earned the title of MVP in the Eastern State Classic. The team made it to the ECT championship making this Jerry's 3rd straight year going to the finals, before losing to Weequahic High School.

His senior year, 1980 to 1981, Jerry became the Star Ledger Boy Athlete of the week for a second time. He averaged 25 points and 13 rebounds per game. During his senior year, he transferred to Vailsburg High School after 14 games with Our Lady of the Valley and finished his high school career with just over 1,500 points.

Jerry attended Upsala College during the years of 1982 to 1986. In his senior year, he placed top 5 in the Country Division III Basketball for a field goal percentage of 63.3%. Jerry averaged 19.1 points and 11 rebounds per game his senior year. He earned the titles of Male College Athlete of the week, as well as All American Division III East Regional in 1985 to 1986. He graduated with a degree in Business Finance, and Economics. Jerry became a Stockbroker in 1986 to 1989 after graduating.

From 1990 to 2000 Jerry was the owner of Precious Metal and Diamonds located in Newark, New Jersey. In 2000, he moved to Wellington, Florida where he continues this business to date.

In 2006, Jerry was named to the Star Ledger All Time Newark West Ward 1st Team. He was a volunteer coach for 8 years in Wellington, Florida for recreational basketball, recreational baseball, and travel baseball.

Jerry has been married 28 years and has one son named Anthony J Gallicchio age 24.

Rayshine "Flip" Harris was born and raised in Newark, New Jersey. A 15-Time World Champion in the sport of Power Tumbling, Rayshine has performed at President Obama's Inaugural Ball, The Grammys, BET and MTV Awards with Anti-Gravity. He has also participated with featured stunts in The Greatest Showman, John Wick II, Many Saints of Newark and was a part of the Olympic Closing Ceremonies with Cirque Du Soleil.

Growing up in Newark, New Jersey, he faced many societal barriers. After frequenting the Boys and Girls Club of Newark, where he was formerly exposed to the sport of Power Tumbling, he decided to commit his extra-curricular life and career to tumbling. Rayshine joined Flip City where he was able to channel his thoughts and overcome many of the barriers he faced in his childhood. Mr. Dave Green, the founder and owner of Flip City kept Rayshine and his team members off the streets of Newark by exposing them to new ventures and opportunities which enabled them to promote positive thinking and amplify their ability to be an inspiration to others.

He was one of six tumblers in the USA invited to perform in the 1996 Olympic Closing Ceremonies held in Atlanta, Georgia. He is also the only USA Tumbler asked to perform in the Gymnastics GALA by invitation only.

Rayshine has participated in many exhibitions and was featured on Good Morning America, half time shows for the New Jersey Nets, New York Knicks, and the NFL Pro Bowl in Hawaii.

Rayshine authored his first book, "Teal: The Heroine Princess" which sold out within the first three weeks on Amazon, addressing issues that so many young children deal with including neglect, obesity and bullying. The book was inspired by his daughter Olivia who loved princesses.

Mr. Harris is currently the coach and owner of SHINE Tumblers. Since 2012, he has contracted with the City of Newark to instruct the first tumbling program for the municipality. Mr. Harris was inducted into the World Acrobatic Society (WAS) in September 2017. He now is a member of their Board of Directors. He also serves as a Board Member for the Boys & Girls Club of Newark. Rayshine received the City of Newark's, Key to the City in April 2021.

He also taught Chemistry and General Science and was the Director of Athletics at Louisville High School in Louisville, Mississippi.

Mr. Johnson proudly served his country by enlisting in the US Army from which he received an honorable discharge. In the 1950's he moved to Orange, NJ, and was employed by the US Post Office in East Orange, NJ.

In 1962 Sol wed the love of his life Ella Coriner Steplight. Mr. Johnson was a teacher of Special Education, Driver's Education, and Physical Education in Jersey City and Newark, NJ. He made history when he became the first Black Head Football Coach at Barringer High School after serving as the Assistant Football Coach. Coach Johnson retired as a teacher, Football and Track Coach from Barringer High School, Newark, NJ where he spent most of his career positively impacting the lives of youth who grew up to be productive citizens. Coach Johnson was instrumental in leading his high school scholar athletes to victory on the football field, at the Penn Relays, in college, and for some, in pro-football careers.

Mr. Johnson was a member of Calvary Baptist Church in East Orange, NJ where he served faithfully on the Welcoming Committee, and also accompanied the Junior Missionaries on several of their local mission assignments. His Widow is Rev. Ella Coriner Johnson. His daughter is Dr. Stephanie Aisha Steplight Johnson, daughter-in-law Ayesha Qayyum, Esq., granddaughter Aaliyah Kamalei and grandson Jabari Kamalei. His son Solomon Samuel Johnson, Jr. a great athlete in his own right, pre-deceased Coach Johnson.

Jack McMorrow was born on Oct. 18, 1906, in Atlantic City, NJ to Irish immigrants. The family moved to Vailsburg section of Newark in 1910 where Jack's father and uncle opened the T & B McMorrow Saloon on Central Ave., young Jack helped in the saloon when he was young but soon suffered from Scarlet Fever and blood poisoning and doctors wanted to amputate both legs. His mother refused and he was confined to a bed with tubes running through his legs, perhaps that's why he had such a love for the outdoors, walking and baseball.

His father passed in 1919 forcing Jack to quit Arts HS and get a job to help support his family.

Jack's love for baseball led him to play for the Vailsburg Collegiates against Seton Hall but never spoke of the outcome, we can assume they lost. Jack then got into coaching and would get ready for the upcoming Pony League season in January and February by sitting at the kitchen table figuring out stats and future players.

Jack married Dolly in 1933 and took the Newark Police exam in 1936, he was notified he passed, but was already working for Public Service Bus Company, where he retired after 40 years of service.

After Dolly passed in 1972, Jack, would move to Maplewood in the mid 70's with his son and his family and went to as many Seton Hall baseball games as he could. He loved his Sunday nights, after taking his grandchildren to dinner, he would be at Cryan's listening to Willie Lynch with a glass of red wine (Because it was good for the heart). Occasionally he would run into one of his former players and talk about his favorite thing, BASEBALL.

Coach Jack McMorrow, "you will never know all the lives you impacted, but it was well appreciated. Thanks Coach, for everything, you will always be remembered as you helped every kid you met learn to love the game of baseball."

Vinny Byron says "Jack McMorrow was my first real coach, who gave me instruction in Vailsburg Park. It wasn't just me, but all the kids in Vailsburg who went from Little League to Pony League. I was fortunate enough to have two other great coaches from Vailsburg as well, Ted Fiore at the Valley in Orange and Mike Sheppard at Seton Hall University, but Jack was my 1st coach who taught the fundamentals of baseball to all who played the game in Vailsburg"
